


1979: entered internship program

remodeling of old worship center into
Fellowship Hall, added Parish Coordinator
and Eucharist Ministry to staff

Changes anticipated in 5-10 years

May, 1989: Long Range Ministry Task Force assembled to make recommendations re, a mission statement, ministry priorities, and staffing. Implementing recommendations expected to result in the following changes: corporate dynamic worship to be highest priority, next in priority will be pastoral & lay visitation, an area of mission outreach will be selected and developed; current staff size will remain as is. Influence in community will be expanded & strengthened.
